

## **Private 4684738 Tom Horberry**

He is buried in grave No 32. At the outbreak of hostilities in WW2 he was a private in the KOYLI (Kings Only Yorkshire Light Infantry). Because there was no RAF Regiment at that time he was given duties of guarding the airfield. On returning from a raid on the 28<sup>th</sup> September 1940, one of our damaged aircraft crashed into his sentry hut and he was sadly killed. His is the only soldier grave amongst the war graves.
