

## **PILOT OFFICER C M LOCHHEAD 41718**

Clifford Molyneux Lochhead was born in about 1920. Little is known about his background at the present time although it is possible he may have been South African with connections to the Transvaal.

An announcement in the London Gazette on 24 March 1939 indicated that Lochhead had been granted a short service commission as an Acting Pilot Officer on probation in the Royal Air Force (service number: 41718) with effect from 7 March 1939.



Pilot Officer Lochhead died on 18 September 1940.

He was shown in official records as having 'died on active service'.



Lochhead was buried at the Church of St John the Baptist, Scampton. He was 20 years of age. His grave is marked by a Commonwealth War Graves Commission headstone.

The circumstances of death are that at 23.59 hrs on the night of Wednesday 18 September 1940 P/O Clifford Lochhead (aged 20) was killed in a motor cycle accident.
